We are changing the lives of budding young artists who would otherwise have very little access to self-expression and skills development in the arts... And they are blooming!

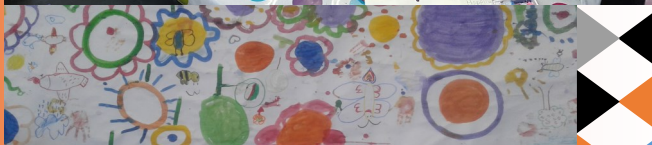
Visual Arts Classes are held in the afternoons for children from a variety of schools throughout Hermanus, including Zwelihle, Mount Pleasant and Hawston. Classes include a variety of mediums and themes and are taught by two experienced and passionate art teachers, Ashleigh Temple-Camp and Karin von Maltzahn. The children are encouraged to express themselves as well as learning a variety of art skills. The environment at Enlighten is one of acceptance of self and the differences of others and the art class is the ideal spaces to develop this.

The art classes for young teenagers (Grade 7's) focus on 'opening the doors to creativity', giving the teens an all round experience of various forms of art. In addition to learning many artistic skills, free expression draws on the healing power of art and encourages the development of emotional awareness, intuition and imagination. Learners are presented with the possibility of working in the arts as adults. Watch this space!



Art classes for younger primary children from all over Hermanus, including Zwelihle, Mount Pleasant and Hawston take place once a week at Enlighten.

Children get the chance to explore, learn and express themselves in a variety of mediums and themes. The space is quiet and undisturbed by the outside world, allowing the children space to express their experiences through art, as well as create works that they can feel proud of, building self esteem.
